

## MSC boss Soren Toft takes the chair at World Shipping Council

Mediterranean Shipping Company (MSC) chief executive Soren Toft has been elected as the new chairman of the liner lobby group, the World Shipping Council (WSC).

Randy Chen, vice chairman of Taiwanese containerline Wan Hai, has been elected vice chair.

Toft and Chen will serve a two-year term, succeeding Rolf Habben Jansen, CEO of Hapag-Lloyd, and Jeremy Nixon, CEO of Ocean Network Express (ONE), who have been co-chairs of the WSC since November 2020.

"It is an honour to step into the role of chair for the World Shipping Council and to represent the global liner shipping industry alongside our members. WSC is today a respected voice of liner shipping, engaging with governments and organisations globally," Toft said.

"An ever-changing world presents both challenges and opportunities for our industry as we head into the future, and I am eager to further advance our work to shape the future growth of a socially responsible, environmentally sustainable, safe and secure shipping industry," MSC boss for the past four years and former chief of operations at Danish liner Maersk added.
